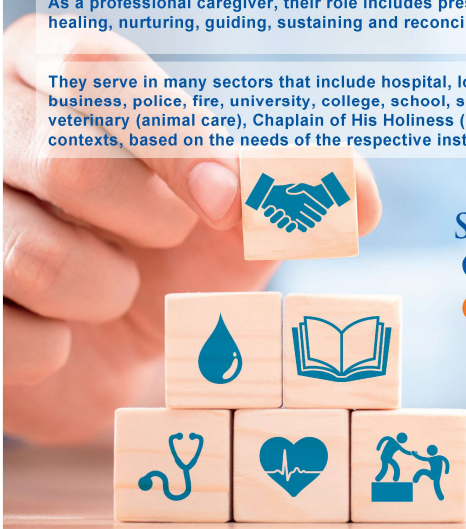


WHAT IS A SPIRITUAL CARE PROFESSIONAL?

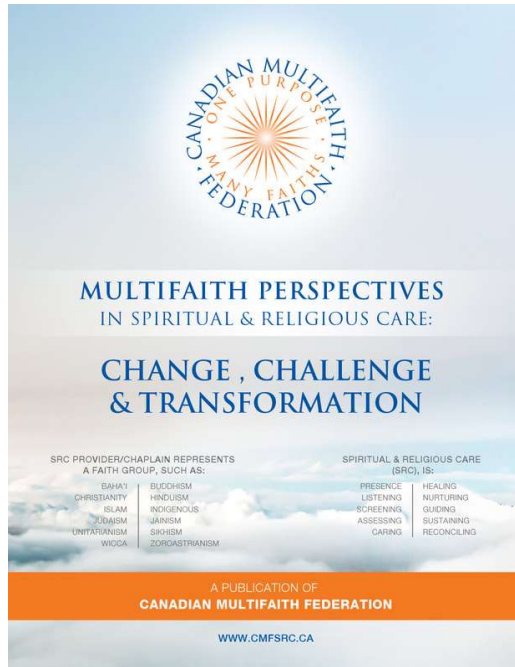

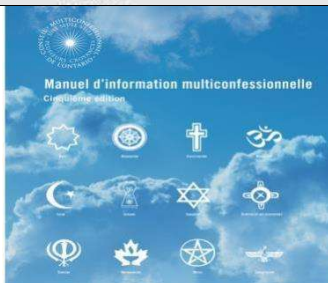

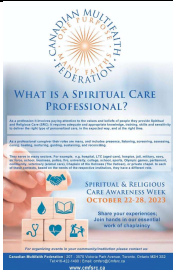
